Pastor's Message

On the 4th Commandment.

Honor your father and your mother. What does this mean for us? – We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them. –Luther, Small Catechism

From the Gospel of St. John Ch. 19 – "So the soldiers did these things, ²⁵ but standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶ When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" ²⁷ Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home."

From Jesus' own words we see how he honored his mother even to his dying breath. God has given parents a unique task to serve the good of human society by raising up good and virtuous children. He has given Christian parents the most noble task of all—instructing their children in the saving doctrines of Jesus Christ, that they might grow up, live and serve within the community of Jesus' holy Church. That people would have merely just a basic familiarity with the central doctrines of the Christian Faith, was the chief reason that Luther wrote the Small Catechism and the reason why parents are still instructed to use it as a tool to teach their children about the love, grace and mercy of Jesus Christ.

Parents serve in the unique role of God's representatives on earth through which he bestows, cares for and nurtures human life. However according to Luther, the 4th Commandment most certainly extends to those other people to whom God has given authority over us for our good—pastors, teachers, the government, employers, because they also serve as God's representatives for your good and protection on earth.

I think every Pastor who has ever taught the 4th Commandment has been asked by his students: "When is it ok to disobey my parents?" -A fascinating question and certainly one that's indicative of the universal condition of human brokenness which often times believes it will

find pleasure and satisfaction in <u>dis</u>obedience rather than obedience. The correct answer to this is rather simple. Our parents, and maybe we ourselves, may have carried out rather poorly the duty of being God's representative to those he's put under our authority. Maybe they drank too

much, maybe they were neglectful, maybe they didn't teach us the doctrines of the Christian Faith or even make sure someone else did. Nonetheless, we are to still to recognize and respect them as those whom God has chosen to represent Himself to us—however well or poorly they do it. However, if they require us to disobey God's Word then not only are we "allowed" to disobey them, it becomes our duty to do so, as the Word of God instructs: *We must obey God rather than men.* Acts 5.29.

One distinction that's helpful to make in this is the difference between "permission" and "compulsion". When a government *compels* us to live contrary to the Word of our God, then we *must* disobey and instead live as God intends humanity to live. However, when a government (God's sword-wielding servant for your good – Romans 13) only permits things that are contrary to God's Word, for example, abortion, torture, same-sex marriage, etc. then the faithful response of the Christian is not to take the sword into one's own hands in order to lash out in violence against God's wayward servant, the government. The right response is rather to bear witness to what is good and true and right by actually living as God intended. Right now in this country, even though we may feel pressure from the culture to submit to and approve of such things as mentioned above, we enjoy a freedom from the compulsion to do so. For this we must thank and praise God. This may not be the case in the future and it's certainly not the case right now for our brethren called to bear witness in places like China, Afghanistan or North Korea. Pray for our brethren there and that our children's children will have a place on this earth to live out the peace of Christ, until he returns and calls us into his Father's House forever.


