Pastor's Message

The Eighth Commandment - Thou shall not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

What does this mean for us? A. We are to fear and love God in such a way that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, assume the best of his intentions in everything he does.

Wow! That's a hard one!

In Bible Study this past Wednesday it was brought up how utterly severe Ananias' and Sapphira's punishment was for lying to the Apostles (They immediately dropped dead!) Too often we think of the sin of lying as a "non-offensive" sin that doesn't really do any damage, after all it doesn't cause bodily harm and seem to make a lot of waves in the communities in which I belong—certainly not like murder, rape or stealing. But of this Ananias and Sapphira were warned in the Word of God: "A liar will not go unpunished, and he who breathes out lies will not escape." Proverbs 19.5 The punishment is severe and indeed fits the crime. This is because a liar does indeed do real violence to others.

In many ways lying is the worst sin. Where the sins mentioned above are sins of the body, lying is a sin of the soul. A lie is so very grievous because it is a direct offense against God who is Himself Truth. Every lie stands not only in direct opposition to the Gospel but also in direct opposition to Jesus Christ. The Lord condemns lying as a work of Satan, "You are of your father the devil... there is no truth in him whatsoever. When he lies he speaks according to his own nature, for he is a liar and the father of lies".

Our Father is the Father of Truth, even Jesus Christ and so it is our duty to defend our neighbor against slander and false accusations. Even if we don't like the person all that much it is our obligation to God to speak well of them, not spreading rumors or gossiping and thereby hurting their reputation. In short we are called to love one another. This means that we are to look at the actions of our neighbor and put the best possible construction on what they've done, and then explain what they've done to others in the best possible light. For the Word of God says this: "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

And if this is what we are called by God to do, we should never our ability to accomplish it by his help and Presence. For God never calls us to ventures of which he has not prepared us for and made us able to complete.


