Pastor's Message

Grace and peace to you from Him who is, who was, and who is to come.

The first words from Jesus for Lent, we receive on Ash Wednesday: "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward." But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret." Matthew 6.

It may seem strange hearing those words while you have just somewhat *disfigured* your face with ashes. It may seem like you are transgressing the exhortation of the Lord, Jesus but you are not. We do not receive the ashes so that we *may be seen by others*! We receive them to call to our minds the kingdom of dust and ash and death that Adam and we belong to without and apart from our Lord. Sinners tend to eventually think too much of themselves. This sinner would probably do well to hear the pronouncement that 'I am dust and to dust I shall return' more than just the bare minimum of once per year. Nonetheless, this dusty declaration (and not the baptismally bathed Holy Absolution) is what concludes the Ash Wednesday Confession and marks the beginning of our Lenten walking.

Ash Wednesday is a severe lashing with God's holy Law—and yet we welcome and embrace it all that it may sweeten the hearing of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ in us. We have the advantage of looking at the kingdom of dust and ash in the rear-view mirror! However, like sirens to sailors, in this life that dark kingdom is always eerily calling to us. And so it is ours to struggle against this kingdom, to discipline ourselves by the help of God who is our Father.

And so we enter this holy season with rended and torn open hearts ready to be filled to the brim with unending grace; with weeping and contrition over our sins because they have hurt our God and King; with fasting that we may discipline and train our bodies and stand firmly against the kingdom of dust and ash; with prayer that his love would continually be on our minds, in our hearts, and on our lips; with works of mercy that we actively love those whom our Lord loves. Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight his paths directly to your heart. God bless you on the Way.

Cemetery Committee Annual Report for 2019

In the year 2019, the second year that the Ancestry Fund was in existence, volunteers have made it a very successful year in maintaining the lawn and grounds of the cemetery with a quality that has not been seen for decades. Many abandoned gravesites that had become overgrown, or generally poorly kept, were cleaned and had the overgrowth removed. In addition, many dedicated volunteers who believe in the importance of respecting those who have gone before us have also made it a safer place by destroying the vast majority of fire ant nests.

I am proud to report that the volunteers who responded to requests for help came from many places. As you would suspect the Lutherans were very strong supporters with their time and talent, but also there were volunteers from the First Presbyterian Church – Stanley that worked very hard on the days they dedicated to assisting with this cause. In addition, several unaffiliated Stanley citizens dedicated some of their time and talent in helping to beautify the cemetery. The evidence of the result of their work is easily noticeable by the number of grave monuments decorated by flags and/or flowers. All this hopefully makes descendants of the ancestors and Town of Stanley citizens proud to have the Stanley Cemetery as the final resting place for their relatives and/or as a historic site in Stanley.

In regard to funding, the Ancestry Fund received many donations from individuals who have relatives in the cemetery, and from local citizens who have no relatives in the cemetery but feel the moral responsibility. <u>Unfortunately, many people who donated in</u> <u>2018 did not repeat donating in 2019</u>. In addition, many people with relatives in the cemetery have never donated to the Ancestry Fund. A perpetual care fund (i.e. unending support for the care of the cemetery) remains the most important goal of the Ancestry Fund. Please consider supporting this important mission and donating annually until this goal is reached.

If you have never donated before and would like to donate at a very affordable level please consider designating \$2.00, \$3.00, \$4.00, \$5.00 or \$10.00 etc. weekly or monthly in your offering. No donation is too small. The creation of the perpetual care fund is too great a need to go unsupported.
