Pastors Message

Grace be unto you and peace from Him who is, and who was, and who is yet to come.

Life in this fallen world throws us curveballs. The year of our Lord, 2020 has been a testament to this fact. In May of this year, I remember thinking, "*At last! We're finally on the other side of this worldwide pandemic!*" And yet here we are 4 months later, standing at Homeplate to go to bat against Covid again, this time a different strain of the virus. It's like a bad, real-life remake of the movie Groundhog Day! As a church family, we've got in our sights the celebration of Homecoming, the Dedication of the Chime Tower in the garden, New Member Sunday, Halloween and All Saints Sunday—some of which will now likely have to be reenvisioned or postponed a bit.

Growing up, one of my favorite sports was baseball-that "great American pastime" that is unfortunately truly becoming a pastime. One of the most helpful things in learning how to hit the ball well when you stepped up to the plate, was to have studied the pitcher well. With regard to Covid, we now know more than we did at this time last year. We know that distance is helpful, as is wearing a mask in public (despite the fact that our government, through the CDC, told us that it wasn't early on in 2020). Also, now we have a vaccine that is at least somewhat effective against the virus. In fact, one ICU nurse that I know has reported to me that it's not really the elderly that are dying from Covid anymore because most are now vaccinated, it's mainly the young (40-60) who have not been. This is vastly different than last year when Covid was ripping through our hospitals and nursing homes. At least now people have the option to get vaccinated where before they didn't. One more thing we've also learned (if we didn't know it already) is that *we* are not in control. We forget that fact very easily. The Holy Trinity is in control, he holds all things in his hand, and he will never leave us to fend for ourselves-not in a worldwide pandemic; nor in any other situation that we may find ourselves in. So, where I might have thought back in May that we were on the other side of this, alas I was wrong—as men who see through a mirror darkly often are. God, in his unfathomable wisdom and love has deigned to let Covid-19 continue for a time. For what reason, I am not privy to. What I do know this: All things work together for our good- and, yes, "all things" means even Covid. Somehow in the mystery of God's divine and holy will this ongoing pandemic is serving the good of God's people. We can't see that now, but one day we will.

Conversely to the above, I have somehow found myself in a group text chat with various "pastors" (not Lutheran) who are calling on all of the members of the group to "bind Covid". Not only is this reaching for and attempting to steal that authority which belongs only to God, it also treats Covid as if it were some kind of demon that can be rebuked and bound in prison. This is foolishness. God's sons and daughter are *not* to be about the business of "binding Covid" (whatever that means), we are rather to be about the business of serving and living faithfully unto death with whatever the Lord allows to come our way. To this end, the Sacrament of the Altar will be celebrated at Christ's Church, sins will be Absolved, the Word of God will be preached. The people of God will be strengthened by the means of grace that Christ so freely continues to give to his Church. God has given us the ark of the Holy Church to ride the waves that the storms of this life produce. In other words, he has made us able in every situation that comes our way, to be able to "swing well".

NALC NEWS

Convocation hears vision updates, affirms decisions

The 2021 NALC Mission Convocation heard updates on the 10 points of the NALC's 2020 Vision and overwhelmingly approved two resolutions supporting decisions by the Executive Council to establish a central NALC office in the Dallas-Fort Worth, Texas, area and to add four part-time assistants to the bishop.

The convocation revolved around the 10 points of the 2020 Vision. Each vision point was highlighted with oral and written reports. Opportunities for discussion of each point and questions from delegates were provided.

More than 400 delegates and visitors gathered August 4-6 in Corpus Christi, Texas, for the 2021 Mission Convocation around the theme, "God the Father Creates." The convocation and the events preceding it comprise the NALC's annual Lutheran Week.

2020 Vision Appeal: We are excited to share that we are moving forward with funding and implementing our 2020 Vision with the full support of the bishop and Executive Council. We are working with Cramer & Associates from Dublin, Ohio, a Christian-based philanthropic advisory firm, to execute this powerful and important initiative. We look forward to communicating and working with you on building our future.

Elections: The Rev. Mark Werner of Pittsgrove, New Jersey, and Joel Williams of Erwin, South Dakota, were elected to four-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Dr. Jeffray Greene of Brooks, Georgia, and Matthew Lind of Bainbridge Island, Washington, were elected to the Court of Adjudication.

The Rev. Dr. Amy Little was installed as the General Secretary of the NALC. The general secretary is the chief operating officer of the NALC and manages its administrative functions.

A major address on the convocation theme, "God the Father Creates," was delivered by the Rev. Dr. Steven Paulson. He focused on the significance of the first article of the Apostles' Creed and Martin Luther's explanation of it in his Small Catechism.

Melissa Ohden told the moving story of her life as the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion and now as an advocate for abortion survivors and pro-life policies.

2022 budgets were approved. The Convocation approved a \$2 million Operating Budget for the NALC. Budgets were also approved for the church's designated funds: \$875,000 for the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary); \$215,500 for the Great Commission Fund; and \$143,000 for the Disaster Response Fund.

Prayer for Ethiopia: The convocation unanimously approved a resolution inviting NALC pastors, congregations and members to unite in "intentional and intensive prayer for Ethiopia." Ethiopia is going through a time of significant political unrest. The NALC is in a full-communion relationship with the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, the largest Lutheran church in the world.


Amendments to the NALC Constitution adding language naming mission districts and mission regions were approved. The amendments must be ratified by NALC congregations.

Reports of the work of the NALC's staff, teams, task forces, ministries and ministry partners were warmly received.

The Braaten-Benne Lectures in Theology, which preceded the convocation, focused on God the Father. Other events of Lutheran week included the Women of the NALC Annual Gathering and workshops on discipleship, stewardship and youth ministry.


